John 6:41-71

Murmured - John 6:41; γογγύζω (gongudzo): mutter, murmur. Matthew 20:11, 'and when they had received it (their pay), they murmured against the landowner'; Luke 5:30, 'but their scribes and Pharisees murmured against His disciples, saying, Why do you eat and drink with tax collectors and sinners?'; John 6:41, 43, 61; 7:32, 'The Pharisees heard that the crowd murmured such things concerning Him, and the Pharisees and the chief priests sent officers to take Him'; I Corinthians 10:10 (9-10), 'nor let us tempt Christ as some of them also tempted, and were destroyed by serpents, nor murmur as some of them also murmured, and were destroyed by the destroyer'.*

Is not this - John 6:42; οὐχ οὗτός ἐστιν (ouch houtos estin): literally 'not this one is' i.e. 'is not this one'. When referring to a person as 'this' (houtos) in ancient Greek, the speaker was talking about that person in a derogatory fashion.

Draws - John 6:44; ἔλκω (helko): to draw, lead, impel. John 6:44, 'No one can come to Me unless the Father who sent Me draws him'; 12:32, 'And I, if I am lifted up from the earth, will draw all men to Myself'; 18:10, 'then Simon Peter, having a sword, drew it and struck the high priest's servant'; 21:6, 'So they cast and now they were not able to draw it in because of the multitude of fish'; Acts 16:19; 21:30; James 2:6, 'Do not the rich oppress you and drag you into the courts?'.*

Taught - John 6:45; διδακτός (didaktos): that can be taught, taught. John 6:45, 'It is written in the prophets, and they will all be taught by God. Therefore everyone who has heard and learned from the Father comes to Me.'; I Corinthians 2:13, 'These things we speak, not in words taught in human wisdom, but in [words] taught by the Holy Spirit, comparing spiritual things with spiritual things'.*

For - John 6:51; ὑπέρ (huper): for, on behalf of, instead of. John 18:14, 'Now Caiaphas was he who gave counsel to the Jews that it was expedient that one man die for the people' [for = 'in the place of', the people = ὁ λαός = the Jews; here the only time in John]; Galatians 1:4, 'died for our sins';

Then Jesus said to the Twelve, Do you want to go away, too? Simon Peter answered him, Lord, to whom shall we go? You have words of eternal life, and we have believed have recognized that you are the Messiah, the son of the living God.
