THEOLOGICAL STUDIES CURRICULUM

The Theological Studies Curriculum is designed to equip those students wanting to grow in their knowledge and have a desire to serve in the Body of Christ. Some students may also choose to prepare for extended education possibilities

Plan of Study

Classes of the Theological Studies Curriculum are conducted in two parts: a DVD home study (min. approx. 5-7 hours per week) and an in-classroom discussion one evening per week (approx. 1.5 hours per week). Two courses (2 credits each) are conducted each 12-week term. There are 5 terms for completion of the standard program totaling 20 credits (6 terms totaling 22 credits for advanced program). The program is divided into three areas of specialization: Bible Training, Practical Ministry and Theology.

Graduation Requirements for a Certificate of Completion

A certificate of completion is awarded in the School of Ministry upon completion of all 20 credits with a grade of "C" or better in all areas of study, and an advanced certificate of completion is awarded upon completion of all 22 credits with a grade of "C" or better in all areas of study.

COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

TS 101 Hermeneutics

This course will examine the science of the methodological principles of interpretation of the Bible, known as hermeneutics, which enables the students to determine the meaning of Scriptures in its literal-grammatical-historical context. Text: *Basic Bible Interpretation*, Roy Zuck (\$17.99)

TS 102 Bibliology

This course is a systematic introduction of the doctrine of the Bible focusing on the origin of the Bible with a cursory examination of the nature of revelation, inspiration, inerrancy and illumination of the Scripture. Text: *New Evidence That Demands A Verdict*, Josh McDowell (\$17.99)

TS 103 Eschatology

This course is a systematic introduction of the doctrine of the Second Coming of Christ. The class will complete and in-depth review of the interpretation of prophecies as they relate to the Second Advent in relation to biblical covenants, the rapture, the tribulation, the millennium and the eternal state. Text: *Things to Come*, J. Dwight Pentecost (\$21.99)

TS 104 Biblical Theology

This course is a systematic introduction of the doctrine of God, His nature, characteristics and attributes. Text: *Attributes of God, Vol. 1 & 2*, A.W. Tozer (\$11.99 each)

TS 105 Christology

This course is a systematic introduction of the doctrine of Jesus Christ and all topics related to the deity of Jesus, His virgin birth, sinless life, physical death, bodily resurrection and ascension into heaven and eternal ministry as it relates to His Lordship over the church and all believers. Text: *The Incomparable Christ*, J. Oswald Sanders (\$9.99)

TS 106 Pneumatology

This course is a systematic introduction of the doctrine of the Holy Spirit, specifically the personality and work of the Holy Spirit. Text: *Basic Theology: A Popular Systematic Guide to Understanding Biblical Truth*, Charles C. Ryrie

TS 107 Apologetics

This course will examine the biblical principles supporting a rational defense of the Christian faith by examining the way people think beginning with their belief (or non-belief) in the existence of God and concluding with the biblical purpose of apologetics, that is to win a person to Christ with a ready defense of the hope that lies in every believer with meekness and fear. Text: *New Evidence That Demands A Verdict*, Josh McDowell

TS 108 Soteriology

This course is a systematic introduction of the doctrine of salvation. The class will confront the issue of salvation as it originates in the mind of God, depends on the grace of God, requires the ministry of the Holy Spirit, centers in the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ and demands a human response that results in a new position and relationship to God. Text: *Basic Theology: A Popular Systematic Guide to Understanding Biblical Truth*, Charles C. Ryrie (\$21.99)

TS 109 Old Testament Survey

This course surveys the entire Old Testament as a unified work of the Holy Spirit. It is a progressive revelation of the character and work of God concerning prophecies regarding Jesus Christ and the power indwelling of the Holy Spirit. This study is designed to motivate students to discover God's truth by their own initiative and investigation. Text: *Jensen's Survey of the New & Old Testament*, (\$44.99)

TS 110 New Testament Survey

This course surveys the entire New Testament as a unified work of the Holy Spirit as a progressive revelation of the character and work of God especially in the persons of Jesus Christ and Holy Spirit. This study is designed to motivate students to discover God's truth by their own initiative and investigation. Text: *see above*

Elective Courses

TS 001 Biblical Counseling

This course is a biblical study of counseling from God's perspective. The major emphasis is on what the Scriptures say about the process of counseling one another with biblical warnings concerning man's method of counseling. Text: *How to Help People Change*, Jay Adams (\$9.99)

TS 002 Homiletics

This course is a study of expository preaching and teaching preparation. Students will complete a comprehensive study of homiletics exploring the definition, design, discipline, delivery and dependency on the Bible for teaching and preaching. Text: *Biblical Preaching*, Haddon H. Robinson (\$13.99)

TS 003 Introduction to Greek New Testament

GREEK NEW TESTAMENT CURRICULUM

The Greek New Testament curriculum is designed so that students may gain the ability to read and study the Greek New Testament. The time invested in learning this tool for ministry will return a thousand fold in the blessings of delving into the scriptures in a way not possible without this ability.

The first year will concentrate on obtaining a basic knowledge of accidence (the formation of words) and syntax (how the words function together in sentences). Within the First Year Greek New Testament, the student will also be introduced to the Greek New Testament text, textual criticism, and the use of a Greek concordance to study words in their context in the Greek New Testament.

The second year will concentrate on advancing the students' knowledge of syntax while reading the Greek New Testament and conducting exhaustive word studies. Discussions concerning textual history, evidence, and criticism will be integrated into the examination of the Greek text.

Upon demand, a third year will be offered in which books of the Greek New Testament will be read and studied in depth.

COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

GNT 101 First Year Greek New Testament

The first trimester covers Nouns, personal pronouns, demonstrative pronouns, adjectives. Emphasis on declensions and the case functions.

GNT 102 First Year Greek New Testament

The second trimester builds upon GNT 101 and introduces the verb and covers tense, mood, and voice. The main emphasis is on the Indicative mood. Prerequisite GNT 101.

GNT 103 First Year Greek New Testament

The third trimester continues to build upon GNT 101 and 102 and introduces participles, the genitive absolute, the subjunctive, imperative and optative moods along with the infinitive. Prerequisite GNT 102.

GNT 201, 202, 203 Greek Exegesis

The second year will concentrate on advancing the students' knowledge of syntax while reading the Greek New Testament and conducting exhaustive word studies. Discussions concerning textual history, evidence, and criticism will be integrated into the examination of the Greek text.

GNT 301, 302, 303 Applied Greek Reading

Upon demand, a third year will be offered in which books of the Greek New Testament will be read and studied in depth applying all that has been learned in years 1 and 2 of our Greek New Testament classes. The student will be introduced to the Septuagint and other Greek texts relevant to the study of the Greek New Testament.
